Resolution 22

A Resolution declaring that a majority of the votes cast at an election held on January 6, 1951, on the question of annexing certain adjoining territory to Silver Lake Water District were for annexation and that by reason thereof the lands described in this Resolution are made a part of Silver Lake Water District.

WHEREAS, at an election held in the territory described in the body of this Resolution on the question of annexing said territory to Silver Lake Water District nine votes were cast for annexation and three votes were cast against annexation, Now, Therefore,

BE IT RESOLVED BY THE BOARD OF COMMISSIONERS OF SILVER LAKE WATER DISTRICT, SNOHOMISH COUNTY, WASHINGTON:

Section 1: That by virtue of the fact that at an election held in the territory hereinbelow described on January 6, 1951, on the question of annexing the hereinbelow described territory to Silver Lake Water District, a majority of votes cast upon the question were for annexation -- IT IS HEREBY DECLARED that the following described territory and lands, to-wit:

The entire plat of Ruggs' Lake also described as the North Half ( $N.\frac{1}{2}$ ) of the  $SE\frac{1}{4}$  of Section 29, Township 28, N. R. 5, E. W. M., Snohomish County, Washington;

and

The entire plat of Straits' Addition to Silver Lake, also described as the West Half ( $W.\frac{1}{2}$ ) of the  $NE\frac{1}{4}$  of Section 29, Township 28 N. R. 5, E. W. M., Snohomish County, Washington,


are now a part of Silver Lake Water District, Snohomish County,
