RULES AND REGULATIONS GOVERNING
THE OPERATIONS OF THE SILVER LAKE
WATER DISTRICT WATER SUPPLY SYSTEM.

SECTION 1: APPLICATIONS: All applications for the use of water must be made to the Secretary of the Silver Lake Water District on printed forms to be furnished by said Secretary for that purpose. Such applications must be made by the owner or the authorized agent of the property to which the water is to be furnished. Said applicant shall state fully and truly all the purposes for which the water may be required and must agree to conform to the rules and regulations and any modifications hereof that may be established from time to time as a condition for the use of the water.

SECTION 2: ACCOUNTS: All accounts for water shall be kept in the name of the owner of the property when known, and all charges shall be made against the property as well as the owner thereof, no change of ownership or occupant shall affect the application of this section.

SECTION 3: All charges for water on fixed or meter rates shall be due and payable to the Secretary of the Silver Lake Water District or his duly authorized agent, within 15 days after notice has been mailed to the consumer, and if not so paid, the water may be turned off without notice from said property and not turned on again unless the said rental and also any other water rentals against said property that might be due and unpaid have been paid in full, in addition to a penalty of \$2.00 to cover charges of shutting off and turning on. Water charges shall be billed at least once every two months.

SECTION 4: PERMITS: No person supplied with water from the said Silver Lake Water District water supply shall be entitled to use it for any purpose other than the purposes stated in the

application, nor add any fixtures; or supply in any way, or for any purpose, other persons or families without first securing a permit for the same from the Secretary.

SECTION 5: COMMON UNDER SERVICE: In all cases where water is to be supplied for several properties from one service, the Water District shall contract with but one of the owners of said property, and he and his property shall be held responsible by the Water District for all charges, the same as if he were the owner of all of the property benefited by said service. The Water Commissioners may require the placing of separate services for each house if in their judgment such service is required. Each family served shall pay the minimum rate for service.

SECTION 6: CONNECTION CHARGES: When a permit has been obtained for the use of water and the charges hereinafter prescribed for the service have been paid to the Silver Lake Water District, the services will be put in as soon as practicable for the Water District to do so. The charges for such services up to and including the stop and water cock shall be paid at time of application and shall be as follows:

For 3/4 inch connection	\$ 75.00
For larger than 3/4 inch connection	\$75.00 plus additional cost of larger meter, pipe and fittings.

SECTION 7: SERVICE PIPES: All service pipes must invariably come direct from the street main and shall be not less than eighteen (18) inches below the surface of the ground with the stop cock placed in meter box at the property line. All of which will be put in and maintained by the Water District and kept within its exclusive control.

SECTION 8: SHUTTING OFF: No person except a duly authorized employee or agent of the district will be allowed to tap any main or put in service pipes between the main and stop cock or to connect pipes where they have been disconnected or to turn water off or on any premises.

SECTION 9: STOP AND WASTE: A special stop and waste cock with a key attached thereto in a cement box with iron cover protected from frost and accessible to the consumer shall be placed on the pipe leading from the district stop cock at the lowest place. No branch pipe, bib or fixture of any kind shall be placed between this cock and the district's main. If this cock does not thoroughly drain all pipes throughout the premises, additional ones shall be placed in on sags, bends, and tracts that cannot other wise be drained.

SECTION 10: DEPTH OF PIPE: All pipes leading from the district's stop cock shall be laid at not less than eighteen (18) inches below the surface of the ground and no work shall be covered up until it has been inspected and accepted by the Secretary.

SECTION 11: ON AND OFF ORDER: Should it be desired to have the water turned on after it has been shut off or where any services have been put in and the plumbing is completed, a written order by the owner of the property or his authorized agent must be given to the Secretary, after which the water will be turned on provided there are no defects or leaky faucets, elements, or fixtures and when such may be discovered, the water will be shut off. A turn-on charge of \$2.00 to be collected before water is turned on, plus any unpaid water bills.

SECTION 12: Should the water be turned on to the premises by anyone except an agent or employee of the water district, after it has been turned off at the main, it will be shut off and not turned on again until the penalty hereinafter provided therefor has been paid.

SECTION 13: SUSPENSION OF USE: Should it be desired to discontinue the use of water supplied to vacant premises for a

period of not less than thirty (30) days, notice in writing must be given to the Secretary. The water will then be shut off and turned on again, on written application without fee of \$2.00, but no remission of charges will be made with the notice prescribed in this section.

SECTION 14: SHUT OFF FOR REPAIRS: The water may at any time be shut off from the mains without notice, for repairs, extensions or other necessary purposes and persons having boilers supplied by direct pressure from the mains are cautioned against danger of explosions or collapse and where meters are in use or to be used on such services a safety valve shall be placed between the boiler and the meter at the owners' expense, who shall be responsible to the district for all damages to meters caused by hot water. The district shall not be responsible for the safety of boilers on the premises of any water consumer.

SECTION 15: DURING FIRES: No person shall use water for irrigation, or sprinkling purposes during the progress of any fire in the water district and all irrigation or sprinkling shall be immediately stopped when an alarm of fire is sounded in any part of the water district. For any violation of this rule a penalty of \$10.00 for each offense shall be imposed and taxed against the person and premises supplied and the water shall be turned off and so remain until said penalty and all other charges are paid.

SECTION 16: ACCESS TO BUILDINGS: Agents and employees of the Water District shall have free access at proper hours of the day to all parts of buildings to which water may be delivered from the district mains for the purpose of ascertaining and inspecting the conditions of the pipes and fixtures and manner in which the water is used.

SECTION 17: ACCESS TO STOP COCKS AND METERS: The Water District, its agents or employees, shall have free access to all stop cocks and water meter covers. All persons are prohibited from piling rubbish or building material thereon.

SECTION 18: SPRINKLING: Sprinkling rules and regulations will be adopted by the Board of Water District Commissioners from time to time as the occasion and necessity may require and notice thereof given to water users.

SECTION 19: METER RATES: The monthly rate for the use of water per 100 cubic feet shall be as follows:

First 700 cubic feet or less \$2.50
Next 1400 Cubic feet @ 25¢ per 100 cubic feet
All over 2,000 cubic feet @ 20¢ per 100 cubic feet.

SECTION 20: The president of the water district commission is authorized in case of any shortage of water to order the stoppage of sprinkling for such time as he may fix and after such order has been published in any newspaper in Everett doing the official printing. Every person violating the same shall have a charge of a sum not to exceed ten dollars (\$10.00) placed against the property whereon said violation has taken place and the water may be shut off from the premises of such person until such fine is paid.

SECTION 21: PENALTIES: For any violation of any of the provisions of these rules and regulations the water supplied to the property involved in said violation will be shut off and unless a different penalty has been prescribed herein for the violation, a penalty of two dollars (\$2.00) will be charged up against said property and the water will not again be turned on to said property until all penalties and water charges against the same have been paid.

The above rules were adopted by the Board of Water District Commissioners of the Silver Lake Water District on the 13th day of Sept, 1954.
