RESOLUTION NO. 455**

**A RESOLUTION OF THE BOARD OF COMMISSIONERS OF THE SILVER LAKE
WATER DISTRICT, SNOHOMISH COUNTY, WASHINGTON, ESTABLISHING NEW
AND UPDATED GENERAL FACILITY CHARGES FOR SEWER CUSTOMERS**

WHEREAS, after proper notice, due hearing was held on March 16, 1995 by the Board of Commissioners of the Silver Lake Water District to consider an adjustment to the sewer rates of the District; and

WHEREAS, the General Facility Charge of the District for sewer customers has remained unchanged since 1991; and

WHEREAS, the Board of Commissioners have received reports from its staff and its consulting engineers, Gray & Osborne setting forth the expected cost to build future sewer facilities to provide adequate sewer service for the existing and future customers of the District as well as to assess new customers for their pro rata share of facilities already built by the District; and

WHEREAS, based on these reports and other information found in the District Sewer Comprehensive Plan construction of sewer general facilities to allow the District to provide sewer service to all anticipated customers connecting to the system within the next ten years; and

WHEREAS, the Board of Commissioners have reviewed the Water and Sewer Rate Study Final Report prepared for the Silver Lake Water District dated January, 1995 and presented to the District by Financial Consulting Solutions Group, Inc.; and

WHEREAS, the Silver Lake Water District is without sufficient funds to pay for the capital improvements necessary to provide cost effective sewer service to all its customers within the next ten years.

WHEREAS, after due deliberation the Board of Commissioners of the Silver Lake Water District has determined to amend the sewer rates of the District.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Board of Commissioners of the Silver Lake Water District, Snohomish County, Washington as follows:

1. A General Facilities Charge shall be collected by the District for each new connection to the District's sewer system within the Everett sub-basin. These charges shall be:

- (a) for each single family residence, \$2,018.00 per house;
- (b) for each duplex, \$1,715.00 per living unit;
- (c) for each multi-family residential and mobile homes, \$1413.00 per living unit;
- (d) for each commercial facility, \$2,018.00 per Equivalent Residential Unit.
- (e) for each school, \$23.75 per student based on the maximum number of students for a fully developed school facility;;
- (f) for each industrial facility, \$2,159.00 per Equivalent Residential Unit.
- (g) for all other uses, \$2,018.00 per Equivalent Residential Unit

2. A General Facility Charge shall be collected by the District for each new connection to the District's sewer system within the Alderwood Water District sub-basin. These charges shall be:

- (a) for each single family residence, \$1,435.00 per house, plus the Alderwood Water District \$0.10 per square foot charge required to be collected by the District by contractual agreement with AWD;
- (b) for each duplex, \$1,220.00 per living unit, plus the Alderwood Water District \$0.10 per square foot charge required to be collected by the District by contractual agreement with AWD;
- (c) for each multi-family residential and mobile homes, \$1,004.00 per living unit plus the Alderwood Water District \$0.10 per square foot charge required to be collected by the District by contractual agreement with AWD;
- (d) for each commercial facility, \$1,580.00 per Equivalent Residential Unit plus the Alderwood Water District \$0.10 per square foot charge required to be collected by the District by contractual agreement with AWD;
- (e) for each school, \$18.60 per student based on the maximum number of students for a fully developed school facility plus the Alderwood Water District \$0.10 per square foot charge required to be collected by the District by contractual agreement with AWD;

(f) for each industrial facility, \$1532.00 per Equivalent Residential Unit plus the Alderwood Water District \$0.10 per square foot charge required to be collected by the District by contractual agreement with AWD;

(g) for all other uses, \$1,435.00 per Equivalent Residential Unit plus the Alderwood Water District \$0.10 per square foot charge required to be collected by the District by contractual agreement with AWD.

3. Equivalent Residential Units are the total number of fixture units for the applicant site established by using Table 10-1 of the Uniform Plumbing Code currently adopted by the state of Washington or any successor plumbing code divided by 24. Equivalent Residential Unit for industrial users is the maximum cubic feet of sewage flow to the District system for a month allowed by the District for a month divided by 900.

4. Any applicant for new sewer connection shall pay the appropriate General Facility Charge for the subject property, provided however; any applicant for new sewer connection who presents to the District a building permit issued prior to May 1, 1995 for construction of building(s) on the subject property shall be assessed the District sewer connection charges in place prior to the adoption of this resolution.

5. The fees set forth in Sections 1 and 2 are not in lieu of any U.L.I.D. assessments, permit fees or any other fees or charges of the District heretofore or hereafter adopted.

6. Should any part or provision of this resolution be declared by a court of competent jurisdiction to be invalid, the same shall not affect the validity of the resolution as a whole, or any part thereof other than the part declared to be invalid.

7. Any and all prior District Resolutions providing for sewer connection charges or sewer capital improvement charges are hereby repealed.
