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A RESOLUTION OF THE BOARD OF COMMISSIONERS OF THE SILVER LAKE WATER DISTRICT, SNOHOMISH COUNTY, WASHINGTON, CLARIFYING AND REESTABLISHING DEFINITIONS OF CUSTOMER CLASSES AND EQUIVALENT RESIDENTIAL UNITS

WHEREAS, The Commissioners passed Resolution 455 in 1995 establishing new general facility charges; and

WHEREAS, Resolution 455 defines Equivalent Residential Unit for purposes of calculating these charges; and

WHEREAS, this definition does not properly address flows from industrial customers as it should; and

WHEREAS, certain additional definitions will facilitate differentiating among customers for connection charges and monthly billing.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Board of Commissioners of the Silver Lake Water District, Snohomish County, Washington as follows:

- 1. <u>DEFINITIONS</u>: For purposes of determining the class of customer of the District the following definitions shall apply.
- A. "Domestic user" means any and all customers of the District discharging domestic wastewater only to the District sewerage system.
- B. "Domestic Wastewater" means water carrying human wastes, including kitchen, bath and laundry wastes from residences, buildings, industrial establishments or other places, together with such groundwater infiltration or surface water as may be present.
- C. "Industrial user" means any and all customers of the District discharging industrial wastewater to the District sewerage system.
- D. "Industrial wastewater" means the water or liquid carried waste from industrial or commercial processes, as distinct from domestic wastewater. These wastes may result from any process or activity of industry, manufacture, trade or business, from the development of any natural resource, or from animal operations such as feedlots, poultry houses or dairies. The term includes contaminated storm water and also leachate from solid waste facilities.
- E. "Equivalent Residential Units" are the total number of fixture units for the applicant site established by using Table 10-1 of the Uniform Plumbing Code currently adopted by the state of Washington or any successor plumbing code divided by 24. Equivalent Residential Units for an industrial facility are the total maximum gallons of flow per day allowed divided by 221.
  - 2. Should any part or provision of this resolution be declared by a court

of competent jurisdiction to be invalid, the same shall not affect the validity of the resolution as a whole, or any part thereof other than the part declared to be invalid.

3. These provisions shall take precedence over and control any and all prior District Resolutions which are in conflict with this Resolution.
