SILVER LAKE WATER DISTRICT SNOHOMISH COUNTY WASHINGTON RESOLUTION NO. 466

A RESOLUTION OF THE BOARD OF COMMISSIONERS OF THE SILVER LAKE WATER DISTRICT SETTING AND ESTABLISHING SEWER SERVICE RATES FOR THE CUSTOMERS OF THE DISTRICT

WHEREAS, after proper notice, due hearing was held on July 25, 1996 by the Board of Commissioners of the Silver Lake Water District to consider an adjustment to the sewer rates of the District; and

WHEREAS, the sewer rates of the District for sewer customers have remained unchanged since March 1995; and

WHEREAS, the wholesale rate charged the District by Alderwood Water and Sewer District have been raised; and

WHEREAS, the Board of Commissioners have reviewed the staff updates to the 1995 Water and Sewer Rate Study Final Report prepared by Financial Consulting Solutions Group, Inc.; and

WHEREAS, the Silver Lake Water District is without sufficient funds to maintain and operate its sewer system to ensure sewer service to all its customers; and

WHEREAS, after due deliberation the Board of Commissioners of the Silver Lake Water District has determined to amend the sewer rates of the District.

NOW, THEREFORE, BEIT RESOLVED by the Board of Commissioners of the Silver Lake Water District Snohomish County, Washington as follows:

- 1. <u>DEFINITIONS:</u> For determination of monthly sewer rates for various customers the following definitions apply. These definitions are not used for calculation of General Facility Charges nor Connection Charges.
- A. "Domestic user" means any and all customers of the District discharging domestic wastewater only to the District sewerage system.
- B. "Domestic Wastewater" means water carrying human wastes, including kitchen, bath and laundry wastes from residences, buildings, industrial establishments or other places, together with such groundwater infiltration or surface water as may be present.
- C. "Industrial user" means any and all customers of the District discharging industrial wastewater to the District sewerage system.
- D. "Industrial wastewater" means the water or liquid carried waste from industrial or commercial processes, as distinct from domestic wastewater. These wastes may result from any process or activity of industry, manufacture, trade or business, from the development of any natural resource, or from animal operations such as feedlots, poultry houses or dairies. The term includes contaminated storm water and also leachate from solid waste facilities.

- E. "Equivalent Residential Unit" for commercial customers equals the total cubic feet of water for the user for a month divided by 750. "Equivalent Residential Unit" for industrial users equals the total cubic feet of sewage flow to the system for a month divided by 750.
- 2. <u>EVERETT RATES</u>: A sewer rate shall be collected by the District for each customer of the District's sewer system within the Everett sub-basin. These charges shall be:
 - (a) for each single family residence, \$24.45 per residence;
 - (b) for each duplex, \$23.70 per living unit;
 - (c) for each multi-family residential and mobile homes, \$23.70 per living unit;
 - (d) for each commercial facility, \$24.45 per Equivalent Residential Unit or fraction thereof.
 - (e) for each school, \$0.29 per student based on the actual number of students attending such school facility;
 - (f) for each industrial facility, \$26.16 per Equivalent Residential Unit or fraction thereof.
 - (g) for each senior low income citizen, \$15.87 per residence.
- 3. <u>ALDERWOOD RATES</u>: A sewer rate shall be collected by the District for each customer of the District's sewer system within the Alderwood sub-basin. These charges shall be:
 - (a) for each single family residence, \$26.87 per residence;
 - (b) for each duplex, \$23.95 per living unit;
 - (c) for each multi-family residential and mobile homes, \$23.95 per living unit;
 - (d) for each commercial facility, \$26.87 per Equivalent Residential Unit or fraction thereof.
 - (e) for each school, \$0.31 per student based on the actual number of students attending such school facility;
 - (f) for each industrial facility, \$28.75 per Equivalent Residential Unit or fraction thereof.
 - (g) for each senior low income citizen, \$17.47 per residence.
- 4. <u>EFFECTIVE DATE</u>: The rates established by this resolution shall be effective July 20, 1996 and shall remain in full force and effect until further amended or changed by the action of the Board of Commissioners.

- 5. <u>SEVERABILITY</u>: Should any part or provision of this resolution be declared by a court of competent jurisdiction to be invalid, the same shall not affect the validity of the resolution as a whole, or any part thereof other than the part declared to be invalid.
- 6. <u>REPEALER</u>: Any and all prior sections of District Resolutions providing for sewer rates in conflict with this Resolution are hereby repealed.
