

SILVER LAKE WATER DISTRICT

RESOLUTION NO. 51

A RESOLUTION providing for a distribution system of water mains and the doing all other work necessary to make a complete improvement in connection therewith, within the boundaries more fully described in the body of this Resolution, creating an assessment district, creating a Local Improvement District Fund therefor, providing that the costs and expenses of such improvement shall be paid by special assessments in ten equal annual installments under the mode of "Payment by Bonds", said bonds to bear interest at a rate not to exceed six per cent (6%) per annum.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE BOARD OF COMMISSIONERS OF SILVER LAKE WATER DISTRICT, SNOHOMISH COUNTY, WASHINGTON:

Section 1: That a petition signed by the owners according to the records of the County Auditor of Snohomish County of at least 51% of the area of the land within the limits of the local improvement district to be created as hereinafter described in Section 3 hereof, has been filed with the Commissioners of Silver Lake Water District, petitioning that a system of water mains be constructed, and that all necessary work in connection therewith be done to conduct water from the Silver Lake Water District water supply system to the property within the boundaries described in Section 3 hereof, all in accordance with plans and specifications submitted by the Engineer employed by the Board of Water District Commissioners, the estimated cost of such improvement being the sum of \$ 26,370.00 \_\_\_\_\_; that pipes used shall be ~~XX~~ of cement-asbestos or cast iron, together with all appurtenances and work incidental thereto of the approximate size in, on, along and under the following described streets, roads, alleys and easements:

6" pipe lines in Farmer Road from the Stock Show Road to the Brush (Brushrud) Road and in Robeck Road from the Farmer Road to its terminus.

4" pipe lines in the Brush Road and Larsen Rd. from the Farmer Road to their respective termini, and in the Farmer Road from Brush Road northerly approximately 580 feet.

The water lines are to be installed as described above together with the necessary gate valves, pressure reducing valves and appurtenances for the best operation of the water system as determined by the District Engineer employed by the Water District.

The District shall construct and install 4 inch standard fire hydrants in connection with the acquisition and construction of the water district lines throughout the District to be located in accordance with the requirements of the Washington Surveying and Rating Bureau for Zone 1 insurance rating wherever feasible.

Section 2: That all of the costs and expenses of such improvement shall be borne by and assessed against the property included in the assessment district herein created. Special assessments shall be levied against the property situated within such Local Improvement District in proportion to the special benefits to be derived by the property in such Local Improvement District from such improvement, the mode of assessment shall be such as may be determined by the Commissioners of the Water District and without regard to the zone and termini method provided for in laws of 1947, Chapter 155, Section 1, Page 717.

Section 3: That there is hereby established a Local Improvement District to be called Local Improvement District No. 6, which shall include the property described as follows:

Beginning at a point on the North line of Section 19, Township 28 N. R. 5 E. W. M., 608.164 feet East of the Northwest corner of said section; thence proceeding East along said North line to the North Quarter corner of said section; thence South along the North-South center line to the South line of the North Half of the Southwest Quarter of Section 19; thence West to the Southwest corner of the East half of the Northwest Quarter of the Southwest Quarter Section 19; thence North along the West line of the East half of the West half of the West half, Section 19 to the point of beginning, situate in Snohomish County, Washington.

Section 4: That the costs and expenses of such improvement shall be defrayed by special assessments, payable in ten equal annual installments with interest thereon at the rate of six per cent (6%) per annum, under the mode of "Payment by Bonds" as provided by law. Bonds bearing interest at the rate of not to exceed six per cent (6%) per annum, payable on or before twelve years from date of issue shall be issued in payment of said costs and expenses above mentioned.

Section 5: That a public hearing will be held on said Resolution on the 11th day of July, 1955, at 8:00 P.M. at the Leo Nelson home on the West side of Silver Lake and it is directed that notice of said hearing be given each owner or reputed owner of any lot, tract, parcel of land or other property within the proposed improvement district by mailing said notice at least fifteen (15) days before the 11th day of July, 1955 to the owner or reputed owner of the property as shown on the tax rolls of the County Treasurer at the address shown thereon and that a copy of this

resolution be published in at least two consecutive issues of the  
Everett Daily Herald in Everett, Snohomish County, Washington, the  
date of the first publication to be at least fifteen (15) days prior  
to the said 11 day of July, 1955.
