RESOLUTION OF INTENTION NO. 59

A RESOLUTION OF INTENTION to provide for a distribution system of water mains and the doing all other work necessary to make a complete improvement in connection therewith, within the boundaries more fully described in the body of this Resolution, creating an assessment district, creating a Local Improvement District Fund therefor, providing that the costs and expenses of such improvement shall be paid by special assessments in ten equal annual installments under the mode of "Payment by Bonds"; said bonds to bear interest at a rate not to exceed six per cent (6%) per annum.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE BOARD OF COMMISSIONERS OF SILVER LAKE WATER DISTRICT, SNOHOMISH COUNTY, WASHINGTON:

Section 1: That all of the territory within the boundaries described in Section 3 of this Resolution be improved by the construction of a distribution system of water mains, and that all work in connection therewith be done necessary to conduct water from the Silver Lake Water District water supply system to all of the property described in Section 3 of this Resolution, and that said water distribution system be constructed according to plans and specifications to be prepared under the direction of the Engineer employed by said Water District Commissioners for such purpose, the estimated cost of such improvement being the sum of \$32,100.00; that pipes used shall be cement-asbestos or cast iron, together with all appurtenances and work incidental thereto of the approximate size in, on, along and under the following described streets, roads, alleys and easements:

six-inch pipe lines in Second Avenue East from the Stock Show Road south to Walton's Folly Road; thence east to Silver Way and south to West Second Place.

Four-inch pipe lines in 113th Street Southwest and 115th Street Southwest in Plat of Silver Acres; also in West First Place, West Second Place, Walton's Folly Road east of Silver Way, Power Place, Silver Way south of West Second Place in Plat of Silver Acres No. 2; also in Meridian Avenue north from Stock Show Road, First Avenue East to south line Tract 34, First Avenue West to south line Tract 19 in Berg's Addition.

The water lines are to be installed as described above together with the necessary gate valves, pressure reducing valves

and appurtenances for the best operation of the water system as determined by the District Engineer employed by the Water District.

The District shall construct and install 4 inch standard fire hydrants in connection with the acquisition and construction of the water district lines throughout the District to be located in accordance with the requirements of the Washington Surveying and Rating Bureau for Zone 1 insurance rating whatever feasible.

Section 2: That all of the costs and expenses of such improvement shall be borne by and assessed against the property included in the assessment district herein created. Special assessments shall be levied against the property situated within such Local Improvement District in proportion to the special benefits to be derived by the property in such Local Improvement District from such improvement, the mode of assessment shall be such as may be determined by the Commissioners of the Water District and without regard to the zone and termini method provided for in laws of 1947, Chapter 155, Section 1, Page 717.

Section 3: That there is hereby established a Local Improvement District to be called Local Improvement District No. 7 ---, which shall include the property described as follows:

Beginning at the Northeast corner SE $\frac{1}{4}$ SE $\frac{1}{4}$ Section 24, Township 28 North, Range 4 East, W.M.; thence South along the East line of Section 24 to the Southeast corner thereof; thence East along the North line of Section 30, Township 28 North, Range 5 East, a distance of 1666.71' to intersection with the westerly line of the Puget Sound Power & Light Co. right-of-way; thence South 40° 25' 25" West along said right-of-way line to intersection with the West line of said Section 30; thence North along said West line of Section 30 to the Northwest corner thereof; thence West along the South line of Section 24, Township 28 North, Range 4 East to the Southwest corner of SE $\frac{1}{4}$ SE $\frac{1}{4}$ of said Section 24; thence North to the Northwest corner SE $\frac{1}{4}$ SE $\frac{1}{4}$ Section 24, being the centerline of the Silver Lake Road; thence East along the centerline of the Silver Lake Road to the Point of Beginning. The area described encompasses the Plats of Silver Acres Nos. 1 and 2. Situate in Snohomish County, Washington, also the E $\frac{1}{2}$ SW $\frac{1}{4}$ NE $\frac{1}{4}$ SE $\frac{1}{4}$ and W $\frac{1}{2}$ SE $\frac{1}{4}$ NE $\frac{1}{4}$ SE $\frac{1}{4}$. Sec. 24, Twp 28 N.R. 4 E.W.M.

Section 4: That the costs and expenses of such improvement shall be defrayed by special assessments, payable in ten equal annual installments with interest thereon at the rate of six per cent (6%) per annum, under the mode of "Payment by Bonds" as

provided by law. Bonds bearing interest at the rate of six per cent (6%) per annum, payable on or before twelve years from date of issue shall be issued in payment of said costs and expenses above mentioned.

Section 5: That a public hearing will be held on said Resolution of Intention on the 10th day of October, 1955, at 8:00 P. M. at the Leo Nelson home on the west side of Silver Lake and it is directed that notice of said hearing be given each owner or reputed owner of any lot, tract, parcel of land or other property within the proposed improvement district by mailing said notice at least fifteen (15) days before the 10th day of October, 1955 to the owner or reputed owner of the property as shown on the tax rolls of the County Treasurer at the address shown thereon and that a copy of this resolution be published in at least two consecutive issues of the Everett Daily Herald in Everett, Snohomish County, Washington, the date of the first publication to be at least fifteen days prior to the said 10th day of October, 1955.

Section 6: All persons desiring to object to the formation of said district must file their written protests with the Secretary of the Board of Water Commissioners before the time fixed for said public hearing.
