RESOLUTION NO. 88 ^A

A RESOLUTION providing for a distribution system of water mains and doing all other work necessary to make a complete improvement in connection therewith, within the boundaries more fully described in the body of this Resolution, creating an assessment district, creating a Local Improvement District Fund therefor, providing that the costs and expenses of such improvement shall be paid by special assessments in ten equal annual installments under the mode of "Payment by Bonds", said bonds to bear interest at a rate not to exceed six per cent (6%) per annum.

WHEREAS, a Resolution of Intention was passed by the Commissioners of Silver Lake Water District on the 13th day of October, 1958, providing that a system of water mains be constructed, and that all necessary work in connection therewith be done to conduct water from the Silver Lake Water Supply System to the property within the boundaries described in Section 3 hereof, all in accordance with plans and specifications submitted by the Engineer employed by the Board of Water District Commissioners, the estimated cost of such improvement being the sum of \$ 23,000.00; that pipes used shall be of cement-asbestos or cast iron, together with all appurtenances and work incidental thereto of the approximate size in, on, along and under the following described streets, roads, alleys and easements:

A six-inch pipe from Murphy's Corner southward along the Bothell-Everett Highway to the east-west center line of Section 31, T. 28 N., R. 5 E., and

A six-inch pipe in Dumas (Post) Road from the north-south center line of said Section 31 to its intersection with the Bothell-Everett Highway;

Construction to be of permanent type pipe with standard fire hydrants installed at proper spacing.

WHEREAS, at the hearing on November 10, 1958, it developed there were certain protests as to the South Terminus of the main trunk

line and the building of a line on the Dumas Road, so that the south terminus was made the north line of Lot 3, Heatherwood Gardens Division #2, and the line on Dumas Road was eliminated entirely, so as to eliminate some of those persons objecting, and lines will now run as follows:

A six-inch pipe from Murphy's Corner southward along the Bothell-Everett Highway to the North line of Lot 3, Heatherwood Gardens Division #2.

Construction to be of permanent type pipe with standard fire hydrants installed at proper spacing.

The estimated cost of the improvement as now set up is the sum of \$19,000.00.

The water lines are to be installed as described above, together with the necessary gate valves, pressure reducing valves and appurtenances for the best operation of the water system as determined by the District Engineer employed by the Water District.

The District shall construct and install 4-inch standard fire hydrants in connection with the acquisition and construction of the water district lines throughout the District to be located in accordance with the requirements of the Washington Surveying and Rating Bureau for Zone 1 insurance rating wherever feasible.

WHEREAS, by Resolution No. 87 a hearing was ordered on said petition, to take place on the 10th day of November, 1958, at 8:00 P.M. at the Leo Nelson residence on the west side of Silver Lake, and it appearing that notice of said hearing has been given to the property owners in said proposed improvement district in accordance with said resolution and Revised Code of Washington, paragraph No. 57.16.060;

WHEREAS, after due hearing on said petition, it appears to the Commissioners of said Silver Lake Water District that more than sixty per cent (60%) of the owners of land within said district to be created as hereinafter described in Section 3 are all in favor of such improvement and that public convenience and necessity require that said

improvements be made; NOW, THEREFORE,

BE IT RESOLVED by the Board of Commissioners of Silver Lake Water District, Snohomish County, Washington:

Section 1: That all of the territory within the boundaries described in Section 3 of this Resolution be improved by the construction and installation of a distribution system of water mains, and that all work in connection therewith be done necessary to conduct water from the Silver Lake Water District water supply system to all of the property described in Section 3 of this Resolution, and that said water distribution system be constructed according to plans and specifications prepared under the direction of the Engineer employed by said Water District Commissioners for such purpose, which plans and specifications are hereby adopted and approved, the estimated cost of such improvement being the sum of \$19,000.00, to be paid by the Local Improvement District. That detailed plans of said proposed improvement are hereby adopted, are attached hereto, marked Exhibit "A", and hereby made a part hereof.

Section 2: That all of the costs and expenses of such improvement shall be borne by and assessed against the property included in the assessment district herein created. Special assessments shall be levied against the property situated within such Local Improvement District in proportion to the special benefits to be derived by the property in such Local Improvement District from such improvement, the mode of assessment shall be such as may be determined by the Commissioners of the Water District and without regard to the zone and termini method provided for in laws of 1947, Chapter 155, Section 1, Page 717.

Section 3: That there is hereby established a Local Improvement District to be called Local Improvement District No. 10, which shall include the property described as follows:

Beginning at the northeast corner of Section 31, Township 28 North, Range 5 East; thence West to the NW corner of the NE 1/4 of the NE 1/4 of said Section; thence south to the SE corner of the N 1/2 of the N 1/2 of the NW 1/4 of the NE 1/4 of said Section 31; thence along the south line of said N 1/2 of the N 1/2 to the west line of NE 1/4 of said Section

31; thence south along said line to the center of Section 31; thence east along the south line of the NE 1/4 of said Section 31 to the SE corner of the SW 1/4 of the NE 1/4; thence north along the east line of the SW 1/4 of the NE 1/4 to the NE corner thereof; and continuing north 170.7 feet more or less along the east line of the NW 1/4 of the NE 1/4 to a point 330 feet southeasterly from the center-line of State Highway No. 2-A, measured at right angles from said centerline; thence along a line bearing N 38° 11' East which is parallel and 330 feet distant from the centerline of said Highway a distance of 421.8 feet more or less; thence on a curve to the right having a radius of 625.4 feet to the intersection of the south line of the N 1/2 of the NE 1/4 of the NE 1/4 of said Section 31; thence east along said south line to the east line of Section 31; thence north along said line to the NE corner of Section 31, the point of beginning, situate in Snohomish County, State of Washington.

Section 4: A special fund is hereby created to be called Local Improvement District Fund No. 10 Construction Fund, which shall consist in the aggregate of the several amounts assessed, levied and collected on the lots, tracts, parcels of land and other property in said Local Improvement District, and the proceeds of the sale of the bonds of said District, for the purpose of defraying the costs and expenses of such improvement as outlined in Section 2 herein. Out of said fund shall be paid the warrants, interest thereon, and the cost of the improvements herein provided for.

Section 5: That the costs and expenses of such improvement shall be defrayed by special assessments, payable in ten equal annual installments with interest thereon at a rate not to exceed six per cent (6%) per annum, under the mode of "Payment by Bonds" as provided by law. Bonds bearing interest at a rate not to exceed six per cent (6%) per annum, payable on or before twelve years from date of issue shall be issued in payment of said costs and expenses above mentioned.
