The Fire Department has recently contacted the Superintendent concerning the painting of the fire hydrants of the District. The fire district will furnish the necessary paint if the water district will furnish the labor for this painting. The Commissioners agreed to this.

The medical plan for the employees was brought up and this plan would be with the King County Medical Blue Shield at a cost of \$20.35 for each employee. After a discussion on this matter the Commissioners table it.

A letter was read from the Washington State Association of Water Districts pertaining to Senate Bill 2727. This bill provides for the take over by the County of all Water and Sewer Districts. After a discussion on this issue Attorney Jordan recommended that the District be represented in Olympia March 16 at 2 o'clock P. M. to protest this bill. A motion was made and carried, authorizing the Superintendent and the Commissioners to travel to Olympia to oppose this bill, and expenses would be paid by the District.
